**An American Teacher in Argentina** Julian G. Peard, 2016-07-27 An American Teacher in Argentina tells the story of Mary E. Gorman who in 1869 was the first North American woman to accept President Domingo F. Sarmiento's invitation to set up normal schools in Argentina, where she eventually settled. An ordinary historical actor whose life only sometimes enters the historical record, she moved along the fault lines of some of the greatest historical dramas and changes in nineteenth-century US and Argentine history: she was a pioneering child on the US-Indian frontier; she participated in the push for US women's education; she was a single woman traveler at a time when few women traveled alone; she was a player in an Argentine attempt to expand common school education; and a beneficiary of the great primary products export boom in the second half of nineteenth-century Argentina, and thus well positioned to enjoy the country's Belle Époque. The book is not a straightforward, biographical narrative of a woman's life. It charts a life, but, more important, it charts the evolving ideas in a life lived mostly among people pushing boundaries in pursuit of what they considered progress. What emerges is a quintessentially transnational life story that engages with themes of gender, education, religion, contact with indigenous peoples in both the US and Argentina, natural history, and economic and political change in Argentina in the second half of the nineteenth century. Because the book tells a good story about one woman's rich and eventful life, it will also appeal to an audience beyond academe.

**The Forms of Informal Empire** Jessie Reeder, 2020-06-23 An ambitious comparative study of British and Latin American literature produced across a century of economic colonization. Winner of the Sonya Rudikoff Prize by the Northeast Victorian Studies Association Spanish colonization of Latin America came to an end in the early nineteenth century as, one by one, countries from Bolivia to Chile declared their independence. But soon another empire exerted control over the region through markets and trade dealings—Britain. Merchants, developers, and politicians seized on the opportunity to bring the newly independent nations under the sway of British financial power, subjecting them to an informal empire that lasted into the twentieth century. In *The Forms of Informal Empire*, Jessie Reeder reveals that this economic imperial control was founded on an audacious conceptual paradox: that Latin America should simultaneously be both free and unfree. As a result, two of the most important narrative tropes of empire—progress and family—grew strained under the contradictory logic of an informal empire. By reading a variety of texts in English and Spanish—including Simón Bolívar's letters and essays, poetry by

Anna Laetitia Barbauld, and novels by Anthony Trollope and Vicente Fidel López—Reeder challenges the conventional wisdom that informal empire was simply an extension of Britain's vast formal empire. In her compelling formalist account of the structures of imperial thought, informal empire emerges as a divergent, intractable concept throughout the nineteenth-century Atlantic world. *The Forms of Informal Empire* goes where previous studies of informal empire and the British nineteenth century have not, offering nuanced and often surprising close readings of British and Latin American texts in their original languages. Reeder's comparative approach provides a new vision of imperial power and makes a forceful case for expanding the archive of British literary studies.

**Ordinary People in Extraordinary Times** Nancy G. Bermeo, 2020-06-16 For generations, influential thinkers--often citing the tragic polarization that took place during Germany's Great Depression--have suspected that people's loyalty to democratic institutions erodes under pressure and that citizens gravitate toward antidemocratic extremes in times of political and economic crisis. But do people really defect from democracy when times get tough? Do ordinary people play a leading role in the collapse of popular government? Based on extensive research, this book overturns the common wisdom. It shows that the German experience was exceptional, that people's affinity for particular political positions are surprisingly stable, and that what is often labeled polarization is the result not of vote switching but of such factors as expansion of the franchise, elite defections, and the mobilization of new voters. Democratic collapses are caused less by changes in popular preferences than by the actions of political elites who polarize themselves and mistake the actions of a few for the preferences of the many. These conclusions are drawn from the study of twenty cases, including every democracy that collapsed in the aftermath of the Russian Revolution in interwar Europe, every South American democracy that fell to the Right after the Cuban Revolution, and three democracies that avoided breakdown despite serious economic and political challenges. Unique in its historical and regional scope, this book offers unsettling but important lessons about civil society and regime change--and about the paths to democratic consolidation today.

Sarmiento Daniel Balmaceda,2023-05-01 ¿Qué sabemos de Sarmiento más allá de su obsesión por la educación? Daniel Balmaceda recupera los valores de ese hombre emprendedor, apodado el loco, que llegó al poder en medio de una guerra, con la prensa y su propio partido en contra, y que, a pesar de todo, logró convertir a la Argentina en un país atractivo para el mundo. Sarmiento renunció a la masonería antes de asumir, vivió de prestado en casas de parientes y sufrió un grave atentado por parte del mismo bando que propició el asesinato de Urquiza. Cargó con la epidemia de la fiebre amarilla y la mayor tragedia naval de su tiempo. Completó su mandato en medio de una rebelión militar. Lo trataron de borracho, corrupto, inútil y anticonstitucional. Pero el contexto hostil no le impidió expandir los ferrocarriles y el telégrafo, promover la ciencia y la tecnología, impulsar el uso de maquinaria agrícola, concretar el primer censo y fomentar el crecimiento de las economías regionales. Aunque algo arrogante, altanero y soberbio, su inteligencia le permitió adoptar lo mejor del modelo norteamericano que tanto admiraba. Las cartas íntimas a su mujer, amantes y amigos, sus peleas con las maestras norteamericanas, la cuestionada visión del gaucho, la polémica por la supuesta entrega de la Patagonia y el mito de la Casa Rosada son solo algunas de las originales historias que pintan un perfil amplio, a veces ignorado y, sobre todo, cautivador, del presidente que torció el rumbo del país.

Hasta ahora. Este libro atrapante, la primera historia del rugby en la Argentina, viene a llenar ese vacío. Plenas de crónicas y personajes, estadísticas y reconstrucciones de momentos clave, estas páginas abren con la llegada del rugby al país a fines del siglo XIX de la mano de los empleados de empresas inglesas, describen su arraigo entre los sectores acomodados locales después de la Primera Guerra Mundial y el surgimiento de los clubes, y llegan hasta la actualidad, con las polémicas por la persistencia del amateurismo, las iniciativas para llevar este deporte a barrios carenciados y cárceles como instrumento de inclusión social, y también las acusaciones de elitismo, machismo y violencia que en ocasiones recibe. Además, exploran la incorporación del rugby a los Campeonatos Evita bajo el primer peronismo, las controversias por los viajes de jugadores argentinos a Sudáfrica durante el apartheid, y las poco contadas historias de los rugbiers desaparecidos durante la última dictadura militar. Especial para fanáticos pero muy apto para legos, este libro -que tiene ya destino de referencia en las bibliotecas- muestra que la historia del rugby local es en buena medida el relato del intento por ganar un lugar entre las grandes potencias de este deporte, alejadas en espacio y en recursos. En el país del fútbol, el rugby supo encontrar la manera de volverse, también, una pasión argentina.

**Modernidades primitivas** Florencia Garramuño,2022-05-30 Durante las décadas de 1920 y 1930, época de una intensa modernización, dos géneros musicales considerados primitivos comenzaron a percibirse como músicas nacionales: el tango en la Argentina y el samba en el Brasil. Muchos de los rasgos que habían sido considerados como primitivos y exóticos son percibidos durante este período como signos de modernidad. Modernidades primitivas analiza ambas caras de esa transformación, la primitiva y la moderna, y cómo llegan a converger. Florencia Garramuño investiga la red cultural que hizo posible que estas músicas se convirtieran en «nacionales» y «modernas». La construcción del sentido de lo nacional no puede restringirse a límites estrechos, pues el tango y el samba, además de formas musicales, fueron objeto de muy diversas manifestaciones: novelas, poesías, ensayos, pinturas, películas, caricaturas, publicidades, portadas de discos... De este modo, la autora analiza la nacionalización de las culturas a partir de la intersección de estas distintas prácticas: el hechizo de lo primitivo en las vanguardias nacionalistas pero cosmopolitas, el viaje de exportación a Europa del tango y del samba en oposición al viaje de formación, el papel decisivo de los filmes de tango y de carnaval. Su crítica cultural de las paradójicas 'modernidades primitivas' esclarece el proceso mediante el cual lo primitivo no sería valorado por ser exótico sino por estar en consonancia con el significado de lo moderno en la Argentina y el Brasil. A partir de la comparación entre ambos países Modernidades primitivas renueva la forma de leer una cultura latinoamericana atravesada por la diferencia.

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
